Open the Book and do not be afraid to lose yourself in the Word of God...let it become your dependence...your obsession...have others comment how much you changed....how different you are...maybe you even need an intervention. If you seek God and His Closeness...embrace the Book...read His Words, follow the Covenant and you will see things happen.

Council Nominees:



Youth and Family Ministries

Our youth program is a busy! Thanks to some fantastic volunteers, our congregation shares the good news of God's love to children near and far and of all ages. Our Sunday Night/ Youth Night program is busting at the seams with the addition of an adult class at the same time. The senior high has taken over the barn with the addition of some new stairs and the 8th grade confirmation class is a week away from their beach retreat.

We have groups of students planning for Summer Camp at Lutherhill, thanks to parents and volunteers. We have a pair of Moms working on our VBS program, we have 22 youth preparing for the ELCA National Youth Gathering and so much more. Our youngest kids are learning worship skills and having a good time with me during our Children's sermon, and I have a feeling some of our older members are enjoying it too.

All that to say, Hosanna youth ministry is doing great, even in the midst of transition. In this time of transition, we are laying the foundation for the future. God is inviting us to write the next chapter in Hosanna's God story. Here is what I am seeing so far.

Our congregation is growing larger! That is a good thing. In our growing community we will always have some transition. Good folks come in and move away. Roles changes. Times of discernment lead to evolving ministries. Knowing that change is constant, I feel that God is leading us to split the ministry staff into several positions rather than putting all the ministry eggs into one basket. Rather than looking for one person who can speak to Kindergarteners, High School seniors, and small group coordinators, it makes more sense to find a few specialists who can do excellent ministry with a specific group of people.

That is something I believe in and have seen work very well in congregations like ours. The senior pastor, that's me, is a generalist. A person who can do most of the things pretty well. I can do children's sermons and pick hymns and lead meetings and do visits and write sermons and lead youth group. I can do all of those things pretty well, but as we continue to live our mission into being we need experts in each area to expand the program and bring specialized life and vitality into being.

I propose that we start looking for a part-time Jr/Sr High minister. One person who is an expert on youth culture, a great communicator, someone with a contagious charisma and a love for the Lord, someone who can create dynamic programs and share God's truths with our teenage members and their friends.

I propose we start looking for a part-time Children's minister. One person who can share God's love with our youngest members, a great communicator who is an expert and a resource for moms and dads in our congregation with younger kids. Someone who can plan fellowship and teaching events for the students in grade 6 and younger.

And I propose we start looking for someone who can oversee our growing adult program; small groups, women's ministry, men's ministry, couples' ministry. Someone who can bring life and energy into this vital program in our church body. This one is a little less-define than the others, but I believe God will continue to make this work clear.

Please join me for a congregational forum, after the 10:30 service on March 11. I am going to have 3 white boards and markers and I want to curate a conversation about these three positions. I trust that God has a plan for what this will all look like and I believe with my heart that as a community of faith we can discern together our next steps. I hope to see students, parents, mentors, volunteers, and many more caring adults participating in this conversation.
