Dear friends in Christ,

The Christmas Season is upon us!

Weekly, we join together in claiming our mission to "Proclaim the Love of God to all people, so they may know Jesus Christ, Grow in Faith and Follow Christ." This is indeed our mission and our actions help us to live that into being as a congregation and as individuals.

Hosanna exists to proclaim the gospel and demonstrate the kingdom of God in a lost and sometimes painful world. In being faithful to God's calling, Hosanna should be reaching people with the good news of the gospel and welcoming them in to a local community of believers. Welcoming people into our faith-family should be the natural overflow of our faithfulness to Christ Jesus. **The best way to welcome people is simply a one-to-one invitation**.

- 67% of Americans say a personal invitation from a family member would be very or somewhat effective in getting them to visit a church.
- 63% of Americans say a personal invitation from a friend or neighbor would be very or somewhat effective in getting them to visit a church.
- 63% of Americans are very or somewhat willing to receive information about a local congregation or faith community from a family member.
- 56% of Americans are very or somewhat willing to receive information about a local congregation or faith community from a friend or neighbor.

So, people ARE open to an <u>invitation</u> to church, particularly if it is from someone they know. However, one simple invitation isn't necessarily going to result in subsequent attendance. You may need to offer repeat invitations. Neighbors may come to Hosanna because of your invitation, but they'll stay for our community.

Mwana Mission Project Update:

This past June, Jan Sawa was asked to come to Malawi by Field Director Francis Chulinga.

He wanted to show her the devastation and impact on the villages surrounding the Mwana Mission Project property. Since the flooding in 2015, severe

drought has plagued this very small country. The borehole/Well on the property after many attempts to go deeper is currently dry. So many in the village have died or are starving and begging for food. Prior to the trip Fair Haven Ministries in Covington had also asked Jan if there was any way possible to check on a container, and clear it through customs. Beans and rice earmarked for a maternity hospital about 20 miles away from the Mwana Mission Property would include 2,000 pounds of beans and rice for the Mwana Mission Project! The "good news: traveled fast through the villages and food distribution was on hundreds of poeoples minds. There was a most heartbreaking story about a very OLD man who walked 15 miles to the compound exhausted gently kneeled down before Jan and Francis and rubbed his belly saying "anjala", "anjala" and "zikomo quambiri amai ndi amuna", then "Zilomo America ndi mzungu". He was saying "I'm so hungry, no eating for days, thank you to the mission and the American people". This is a great reminder that relief and development need to work hand in hand. It's hard to develop people without first offering relief, so that there are no obstacles. God has provided for the people in our village with help from all of you in our community and our Hosanna village. We can't offer relief without a plan of future development, which includes financial assistance from you to continue nourishing their spiritual lives and daily needs. Then Mwana Mission Project staff here in the States and the staff in Malawi thank you from the bottom of our hearts. It is your prayers, support and monetary donations that allow this mission to go forward.

What is the Mwana Mission Project?

The Mwana Mission Project, Inc. was founded in September of 2003 by Jan Sawa, with a memorial gift to a charity in Malawi, in the name of Bill and Jasmine Bray, her late parents.

Jan was raised in Nyasaland during British Colonial Rule (now known as Malawi) from infancy in the 1950's to young adulthood in the mid-1970's. This was her home, her life. One day she anticipated returning to the "Warm Heart Of Africa" but had no idea what a life changing experience would occur in her life on the journey back in 2007, thirty years later.

The trip back in 2007 was mind shattering, the sheer number of orphans and destitute people was overwhelming. There are virtually no government resources in Malawi to tend to the growing amount of orphans, geriatric people caring for all of their grandchildren and Albino's being trafficked for body parts... Something needed to happen, so the Mwana Mission Project, Inc. was started and partnered with many individuals and charities already established in Malawi, to help provide education, teacher support, business entrepreneurship, feeding programs, and more throughout the central and southern regions of Malawi.

The Mwana Mission Project, Inc. is based in Mandeville, Louisiana, and Blantyre, Malawi. It is a registered 501(c)3 Non-Profit, governed by a working board. It is a registered NGO (Non Governmental Organization) in Malawi. Please consider making your tax deductible donations no matter the size, it is desperately needed. With your donation, you will certainly lift the spirits and create a great many smiles on the faces of the Malawian people...

Stewardship Corner

Stewardship Ministry December 2018

Throughout his epistles and his preaching recorded in the Book of Acts, St. Paul refers, in one way or another, to thanksgiving and thankfulness nearly 50 times. Whether vertically toward God, or horizontally toward the neighbor, thanksgiving is a major theme within St. Paul's body of work.

What does this mean? It means thankfulness is intrinsic to the life of those baptized into Christ. In other words, giving thanks is what Christians do as they live out their lives in this world.

The problem is that we often forget this. Consider your average, run-of-the-mill, normal day. When you get home, and your parents, your spouse or your children ask about your day, what first comes to your mind? After 99 percent of things went right, went exactly as planned, were enjoyable and blessings, we tend to focus on and remember the 1 percent of things that went poorly, that didn't go as planned, and that were nuisances.

We remember the bad things. We focus on discontent. And we fail to give thanks in all circumstances for everything (Eph. 5:20) and to rejoice in the Lord always (Phil. 4:4).

Thankfulness and contentment go together. We are content with things for which we are thankful. St. Paul could be content with having plenty or when in need because He gave thanks to the Lord for all things. He thanked the Lord for those who had prayed for him and listened to his proclamation of the Gospel. He gave thanks for their good works in and for the Church of Christ. He gave thanks for the grace of God in Christ Jesus and found that God's grace was sufficient for him.

So, give thanks for all things and in all circumstances dear brothers and sisters in Christ. For you have been saved from sin, death, and hell by the death and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. You have been added to the very family of God in an adoption of grace through Holy Baptism. God is your Father. Our Lord, Jesus Christ is your brother.

But He not only provides for your spiritual well-being, He cares also for this body and life. Your Father in heaven provides food and clothes, house and home, husband, wife, and chil-

dren. He gives you reason and all your senses. He has given you the raw talents that you have developed into careers. Everything you are and everything that you have is a gift from His fatherly divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in you.

Give thanks for these things. Make a list – every morning if you must. Say them out loud. Sing about them within the congregation of the saints. And remember this: God has given you these things so that you may be of service to those around you – your family, your neighbors, your brothers and sisters in Christ. For to whom much is given; much shall be required (Luke 12:48).

October 19, 2018 Hosanna Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes

Attendance: Alex, Brad, Ron, Ryan, Jay, Tara, Stephen, Julie, Carlos

Absent: Ginny

Tara called meeting to order at 7:00 pm and announced a quorum is established

Approval of Previous Meetings Minutes & Reports

Brad motioned to approve September's meeting minutes as amended by Ron, Carlos Seconded, no discussion, all were in favor

New Business

Brad motioned that Ron and Ryan serve as Council representatives in the nominating committee for 2019 candidates for council; Julie Seconded, all were in favor.

After the Treasurer presentation; Julie motioned to accept September's Treasurer's report, Carlos seconded; no discussion; all were in favor.

Carlos motioned that Executive Council, acting as the Investment Committee until their establishment, authorizes the transfer of \$100,000 of the current funds designated as part of the Restricted Building Fund account to the newly established brokerage account at Gulf Coast Bank. This brokerage account was established as a managed brokerage fund using a moderate growth portfolio. All interest and dividends from this brokerage account are to be directed back into the same account to become additional funds directed solely for use under the Restricted Building Fund; Julie seconded; Discussion questioned the portfolio allocation suggesting concern with investing in equities' and suggesting rather to pay on debt. Additionally, the need for a brokerage account was questioned in order to accept certain donations and minimum balance/value was unknown. After 45 minutes of discussion, Tara motioned to postpone a vote until next Council session while Treasurer gathers more info on portfolio options and minimal requirements; Stephen seconded the motion; in discussion, Council was reminded of the monthly brokerage fee for the current account with Chase; 5 were in favor of postponement, 2 opposed, 1 abstained.

Ron motioned that the Executive Council, acting as the Investment Committee until their establishment, authorizes the transfer of \$50,000 of the current funds designated as part of the Restricted Building Fund account to a 13-month Certificate of Deposit (CD) at an agreed upon annual percentage rate of 2.3%. The CD will also act as collateral for the office staff's church credit cards so no financial data from the individual staff members and church will be required. All interest from this CD is to be directed into the checking account to become additional monies under the Restricted Building Fund only; Julie Seconded; No discussion; All were in favor.

Carlos motioned that the Executive Council, acting as the Investment Committee until their establishment, authorizes all stock transfers from congregational members to the church be placed in Hosanna's secondary brokerage account. Once transferred, all stock will be sold from this account by the Gulf Coast Bank representative at the optimum time based on their market research, but not longer than 30 days after transfer, and all resulting monies placed into the church checking account. From here, distribution will be made by the Treasurer or his designee into the appropriate ledger accounts as directed by the congregational member making the donation; Stephen seconded; No discussion; All were in favor.

Julie motioned to authorize \$800 for the purchase of 2 microphones in sanctuary due to current frequencies in conflict with wireless phone frequencies; Tara seconded; No discussion; All were in favor.

Ron motioned to accept the terms of Advanced Office Systems proposal to supersede previous leases for the copier and toner and extend for Five years; Carlos seconded; no discussion; All were in favor.

Old Business

Council then reviewed the current status 2018 Stewardship Campaign and reviewed the forward plan.
