Grace to you and Peace,

This month marks the beginning of my third year as Hosanna's pastor and from the very beginning I have been praying that God would lead me in our mission statement,

"Proclaim the Love of God to All People, so, they may Know Jesus Christ, Grow in Faith, and follow Christ."

I use this as the lens through which I evaluate our programs, our activities, our staffing. This mission statement is how I judge what is working and what isn't. Are we proclaiming? To All people? Does the proclamation lead to growth and discipleship? Lots of questions.

But as you know this proclaiming business is hard. There are all kinds of little steps that lead to bigger steps. There are so many people to get to know in the ALL. There are stories to here and meetings to call, classes to teach as we keep the normal church operations going, while at the same time ministering to those for whom the last season was painful. There are lot of moving pieces in leading a congregation and I will tell you, honestly, I have loved, *almost* every bit of it. We all have *those days*, don't we?

In pastoring Hosanna, I have heard God speak many times. For almost a year, God has been speaking to me that I am called to preach on Ephesians in June. Until April, I didn't really know what God wanted me to say about Paul's prison letter to the church in Ephesus, but I put it on the calendar, dutifully and I trusted that God would let me know when it was time. As we begin this sermon series this month, I am eager for the prophetic word to be shared about living God's mandate in community. God certainly spoke to me in this series.

In leading this congregation, I have often prayed that the all and the growing would manifest in more Sunday worshippers, but lately God has been speaking a clear word to our church that we aren't quite ready yet. We let too many people slip through the cracks, we don't have a clear path for assimilating a new worshipper into our faith family. God won't bless us with more new families than we can handle, and we still have some processes to put back into place.

But God has also been clearly speaking that our church is doing something special in our community. We are sharing a Gospel where all are welcome. We are worshipping in a style that is very open. We are a happy bunch that likes to get together. God is setting the pieces in the right place to pour blessings on us. Friends, we are about to enter a time where our mission statement will guide us through many new blessings.

This newsletter is a testament to the work we are doing in Jesus name in our community. You will find in these advertisements and articles opportunities for mission, new groups for fellowship, discipleship and new member classes and prayers for our youth and children as they experience mission trips and vacation Bibles school. In this work of proclaiming the love of God, there is a place for you. You are already part of the body of Christ, you are the church.




New News!


CHICAGO YOUTH MISSION TRIP JUNE 15-21

Stewardship Corner

June 2019

Some disciples of John the Baptist were questioning him about the baptism and preaching of Jesus. Many disciples were going to Jesus instead of John the Baptist.

John the Baptist answers: "A person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven" (John 3:27).

John the Baptist says this to show that Jesus, His teaching, and His baptism are from heaven. God provides everything we have in body and soul.

We are taught this in the meaning of the Apostles' Creed in the *Small Catechism*.

In the First Article of the Creed, we learn that God has made us and everything in the universe.

"He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him."

In the Second Article of the Creed, we learn that God sent His Son, Jesus, to humble Himself by taking the form of a servant.

In so doing, He "has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity."

In the Third Article of the Creed, we learn that the fruits of what Jesus Christ, the Son of God, did are given to us through the work of the Holy Spirit in the Church.

"That I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ."

Indeed, "a person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven."

But how easy is this for us to forget? How easy is it for us to think that what we have in life is because we have earned it?

How easy is it for us to forget that all our skills – the abilities of our hands and minds, the ethic to work diligently, and the desire to improve – is given to us from heaven, just as John the Baptist said?



How easy is it for us to forget that it is Christ alone, and the work of the Holy Spirit, that reveals His salvation to us, delivers it to us, and that none of this is our doing?

Sure, we have responsibility for coming to church, for delving into God's Holy Word, and for praying without ceasing.

But even these responsibilities are given to us from heaven. These duties are not earned; they are given in response to what He has accomplished for us.

Everything we have, and everything we are – in both body and soul – are gifts from God in heaven.

Let us then respond in thanksgiving and give back to Him as He asks – with a first-fruits, generous proportion offering of what He has given to us.

Hosanna Lutheran Church Council Meeting April 15, 2019

Members Present: George Michell, Carlos Pearce, Ashley, Julie Brown, Rob Rhea, Pastor Jay Grave, Teresa Abrams, Ryan Weber, Sandy Nieto. Pastor Jay opened with prayer at 7 p.m. A quorum was established.

Purpose Area Committees:

Ashley (Lead of fellowship) talked with Ron Entzel who was lead of fellowship last year. He recommended she plan entire year's events now, and also plan to have post-event evaluations with her committee.

George (Lead of worship) talked with Carlos Pearce who was lead last year. The challenge is that more volunteers are needed. Some ideas to increase volunteers in the worship purpose area were to have volunteers recruit and train their own apprentice, plan volunteer schedules farther ahead of time, and get to know more fully what each volunteer is responsible for.

Teresa (Lead of discipleship) spoke with her predecessor (Alex Abrams) and her committee leads.

President's Report:

Small groups encompass any group which meets (ex: bible study, softball, ministry team, etc.) They also serve to help new people get involved in a group, and help small groups grow.

Council Mapping: It is important to have each purpose area interact with all other purpose areas in some way as this can improve our church.

Opportunities: (1) Find ways to identify people who have not been at church as they usually were and find way to reach out. (2) Find way to get exit information from those who have left the church. (3) Integrate next level of Church Community Builder (CCB) to make it easier for volunteers to sign up online.

Calendar on CCB: Can see entire year schedule for all things happening at church or can select to view only a specific area of interest. All events will be booked on the calendar to avoid overbooking and will require specifics about what rooms, chairs, equipment, etc. will be needed.

Pastors Report:

Completed events: Confirmation retreat went well. New council onboarding was successful. Pastor officiated an off-site wedding. New:

- 1) year-long stewardship program with help from a company recommended by our Synod. Estimate of cost approx. \$2000. Pastor Jay will get more information to consider.
- 2) Synod has identified Hosanna as an "Anchor" or healthy church that could help other less healthy churches. Pastor recommends we wait at least a year to consider participation.
- 3) Change in church office hours to 8-3:30 will be handled by Pastor and office staff.
- 4) Pastor Jay was honored by nomination for Bishop for the Kansas/Missouri Synod. At this time he is unable to decline the nomination, but if elected he will turn the position down.

Financial items:

- 1) January income of \$15,000 is more than usual for January.
- 2) Worship attendance is slightly increased.
- 3) Synod Benevolence Fund Audit is in progress. Hosanna contributes \$2800-\$3000 per month, but QuickBooks entries do not match the Synod's receipts.
- 4) IRS has charged Hosanna \$33,000 penalty for late or incorrect filing for 2013 and 2016. Upon review, normal annual payroll penalties and late fees are about \$1,200 per year.

Motion: Julie motioned to hire a tax attorney contacted by Brad to help straighten this out. Rob seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

- 5) Asset Management Policy Development
- 6) Counter's Procedure Development in progress of being drafted by Brad since different volunteer counters methods are causing problems for office staff.

New Business:

Hosanna Preschool has informal policy to allow Pastor's children to attend free of charge.

MOTION: Carlos motioned for a formal policy to offer this benefit to all called and ordained pastors of this congregation. George seconded. Motion passed by unanimous vote.

Biblical Purpose Area Overview is coming up.

Sanctuary upgrade project is in idea and design phase. Quotes for flooring, painting, A/V and electric are being obtained.

VBS dates and information are on the Hosanna website now.

Full council's retreat in June will be focusing on vision for the church. Council members are asked to start thinking of what should be included in the vision, and then later, as a group, we will discuss and decide what is most important.
