Unfortunately, the word *seelsorger* has nothing to do with this cute baby seal. *Seelsorger* is usually just translated as pastor or priest, but the word actually means something deeper than that. A *seelsorger*, is a person who *sorgens* a person's *seel;* that is to say cares for a person's soul. A soul-caretaker. A pastor.

Hosanna's Casserole Club is ready in an hours-notice (at 350 degrees) to provide meals to friends and members of the congregation who find themselves homebound in an emergency. Our Stephen Ministry group has advanced training in long term caring relationships and would love a few more folks to visit. Hosanna is a congregation with a variety of small groups who gather in support of participants in times of need and our divorce care group cares for the souls of individuals in the struggles of relationship crisis. As a congregation, we care well for *seels*.

In the past, and in smaller congregations the *seelsorger* would spend many years developing relationships, learning the histories, participating in milestones within families. The *seelsorger* would live life together and through experience be able to encourage people in different ministry opportunities. This is true here as well. Longer pastorates of course lead to deepening relationships and more effective leadership. In fact, a study done some years ago report that a pastor-effectiveness really doesn't get rolling until their SEVENTH year of leadership. Whoa! Now, I don't really intend to just hang out for four-and-a-half more years to get effective, I plan on keeping on our momentum.

I would love to get to know you more. I also would love to have an opportunity for you to hear my understanding of our congregation, our church body, the ELCA, and of course our mission. I invite you to participate in our 101 class for this reason. In fact, I would love for every member of our congregation to participate in all four of the classes every year. Every member/Every year. These classes are core to our Hosanna disciplemaking process. As your *seelsorger*, I take your *seel* very seriously.



Stewardship Corner

September 2019

What is a steward? Most people will say a steward is a manager.

That is correct, but it is only half right. A steward is indeed a manager, but he is a manager of what does not belong to him. Someone else is the owner, and the steward manages the owner's property on the owner's behalf.

We are God's stewards. Our stewardship is that God has made us managers of what belongs to Him:

"For we brought nothing into this world, and we cannot take anything out of the world" (1 Tim. 6:7)

Everything that we have and everything that we are comes from God's fatherly divine goodness and mercy. God is the owner.

This is not only because He created all things; He is also the redeemer. He has redeemed – that is, purchased – and won all things. Therefore, it all belongs to Him.

We are simply managers of everything in this world. Like Joseph in Egypt, we are put in charge of managing what belongs to God. What a privilege.

Think about that for a minute. The all-knowing, all-powerful, all-wise God has asked us to manage his possessions on His behalf here on earth.

And by doing this, He invites us to take part in the allocation of His good gifts. He wants us to give our input and advise Him in where His gifts are to be used. What a privilege indeed.

But what a responsibility!

"Everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required" (Luke 12:48b).

We are not the owners. And while He puts us as managers, we are still to do with His property what He wants done with it. That means we need to know what He desires and wills for His property.

How do we know this? How can we know the will and mind of God?

We find the will of God in the Bible. There God tells us what His will is for all of His gifts. He tells us how we are to spend our time and use our talents and treasures. He instructs us in the use of our minds, bodies, and souls.

There is nothing we have that doesn't belong to Him.

"Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body" (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

God informs us of the big picture, the overarching policy, of how we as His stewards – managers and custodians – are to manage His property.

And that is stewardship. It is simply doing what God wants us to do with what He has given us.

As St. Paul said,

"Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness" (Rom. 6:13).



So, let's dive into God's Word, and listen to what He desires from His stewards.

Hosanna Lutheran Church Council Meeting July 15, 2019

Opening

The regular meeting of the Hosanna Lutheran Church was called to order at 7 pm on July 15, 2019 in Fellowship Hall by Brad Phillips. A quorum was established. Pastor Jay opened meeting with prayer.

Present

Rob Rhea, Brad Phillips, Pastor Jay Grave, Teresa Abrams, Steve Beene, George Michell, Julie Brown and Sandy Nieto

Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the previous meeting were unanimously approved as distributed.

Open Issues

- 1) Purpose Area Committees
- Discussed needs for committees to accomplish role of purpose areas (Ministry, Evangelism, Worship, Fellowship, Discipleship). Some areas may need to add or reduce committees.
- Council members should check Church Community Builder (CCB) to see if all committees or groups are listed, and update members if any have changed. If starting a new committee or group, be sure to add it to CCB.
- Committee leaders are urged to report attendance on CCB.
- 2) Church Metrics
- Discussed purpose of tracking activity in our church to identify if we are accomplishing our mission/vision and which ones to use. Discussed the ones suggested in "The Numbers Game". Currently we are only tracking number of people at worship services and total dollars collected at each service.
- The following metrics (tracking numbers) were discussed:
 - Numbers of volunteers Online activity Event outcomes Assimilation (Number of new people that come into church and end up becoming members) Spiritual growth Attrition
- 3) Vision Retreat Focus Items (areas that Council decided were most important to focus on to accomplish church's mission this year)
- Improve/develop Hosanna Operating Systems: Progress includes processes for replacing council member, handle injury at VBS, and Pre-K through 6th grade Youth Ministry binder started.
- Successful Youth Ministry
 - Fun Church Fun and Exclamation! Organized to replace Youth Night.
 - Movie Night will be July 19th. A Town Hall meeting for youth and parents will be July 23rd from 6:30-8pm to discuss the "new "youth programs.
 - Rally Day will be August 11. Erin requests Council members be present and volunteer if possible. The new programs will start August 18.
- Professionally Led Mental Health Services No progress on this area yet.
- Discussed need to get this "vision" information out to everyone in congregation. Plan to add newsletter articles and council members to give short 1minute talk during worship services.

4) President's Report

- Staff reviews are in process
- Council action plans spreadsheet reviewed
- Recommend new committee to develop Church App to help increase communication. App is available through Push-Pay (the company that set up our online giving) but needs some customization.

5) Pastor's Report

- Discussed progress on annual staff reviews
- Rev. Anthony Chatman will preach at our Hosanna Lutheran Church (in Mandeville) on Sunday July 21, 2019. Pastor Jay will preach at Rev. Chatman's church (Hosanna Lutheran in Houston) on same date.
- Pastor Jay was accepted into the St. Tammany Parish Leadership Program. He will attend the introductory retreat held Aug 23/24, and the second Wednesday of each month for the next 9 months.
- ELCA Churchwide Assembly is August 5-10
- Anti-Racism Conference at Bethlehem Lutheran Church will be October 10-12.
- November 22-30 Pastor Jay will be on family vacation
- 6) Financial Items
- The accounting transition to Janice Gutierrez is going well
- Brad reviewed Treasurer's Report for January 2019. Brad sent this report to council earlier today.
- Synod Benevolence Audit Report issue has been resolved with good outcome.
- IRS Payroll Tax issues continue with penalties looming for 2013 and 2016 because of failure to report and pay proper amount of payroll tax. IRS claims they did not receive complete info and \$ for 2017 and 2018 also. Church is working with tax attorney about these issues and will need to meet with her soon.
- A Building Committee will be initiated to evaluate current and future building needs.
- Sanctuary Re-Vamp has begun with Painting. Next phases will include getting electrical wiring up to code, replacing A/V equipment and wiring, and replacement of stage and flooring. Funding needed for these projects was discussed. Short talks during worship services to explain need for updates (safety, function, etc.) will help everyone understand project and hopefully will spur further donations to fund it. Letters to congregants and slides on Church Facebook page are considered.

7) New Business

Approval of Financial Report(s) was deferred since Council members did not have enough time to review.

8) Calendar Review

Council members will check calendar on CCB to be sure all events/meetings are posted there

9) Council Homework for August 19th meeting

Think about church "rebranding" for the purpose of letting people in our community know we are a Christian church. It seems people don't really understand what a Lutheran Church is about, and this can be a deterrent to having new people attend.

Adjournment

Meeting was adjourned at 9:10 pm by Brad Phillips after a motion to adjourn by Rob, a second by Julie and all were in favor.
