Grace to you and Peace,

It is November and that is a strange in between month in the church. We have Thanksgiving days and travel in our month. We have budget meetings and congregational meetings as we prepare for a new year of ministry programming. We have shortening days as we move ever closer to the Advent season and we all know Christmas is just around the corner.

This month we also are beginning our search for a new worship music leader in our contemporary service. This is an important task. Bill Easum, church consultant and mentor often says that, second to the pastor, the most important and public figure in congregational leadership is the worship leader. No one else has as much influence over the personality of the worship service.

Our Hosanna Worship Purpose Area councilperson, George Michell, has convened a meeting of a Hosanna Worship Leader Call Team. This team consists of a member who regularly attends our 10:30 service, a member from the 9 am service, a member of the former music team, George, and myself. We will be discussing music and worship, we will take a congregational survey soon, we will brainstorm and evaluate the current job description and make changes. In consultation with the church council, we will begin advertising/interviewing/ auditioning and hopefully hiring the new music leader for our contemporary service as quickly as God allows us. This is too important of a decision to rush or to drag our feet. We trust that God already knows our next steps and we wait for God's guidance.

In the meantime, our current church drummer, Carter, will be organizing and leading worship music. He and I are in agreement that we need to take a collaborative approach. We will continue to feature sing-able worship songs, a mix of songs we know and some new ones. We will hear some new voices and some familiar ones. We will explore some new music styles and be reminded of some longtime favorites, all as a way to prepare for the welcoming of a new staff person to our Hosanna team.

I ask you to please keep this decision in your prayers. We trust that God is preparing just the right person for the job and we need to focus on God's will and not rush or drag the process. As a congregation, we pray, we wonder and we rest, and we discern our next steps. We will update the congregation to our progress.







### From the Council:

What does Evangelism mean to you? It is in the name of Hosanna's denomination: Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. What does it mean? To me, Evangelism is a lot like marketing. It is spreading the word or Word. We are all sinners that need to be saved, and we found the one who reconciles us: Jesus Christ. In turn, He asks us to spread the Word…or market, advertise, announce, endorse, exhibit, promote, and PROCLAIM. This is can be as simple as inviting a friend or family member to Church service, which can be awkward this day and age.

My daughter is often shy and afraid to ask a friend to play a game, so I tell her "I know what the answer is if you don't ask," and quote Wayne Gretsky: "You miss 100% of the shots you don't take."

Convincing friends/family to church, in my opinion, is the easy part. The bigger challenge is to convince them to come back.

Creating an environment that both embraces our newcomers and excites them enough to return does not happen by chance. We must be prepared to be effective stewards of those God brings us. Unless God is involved and his Spirit is blowing across our lives, no amount of structure in the church will produce spiritual growth. Our primary desire isn't to grow His church but to point people to a relationship with Jesus Christ. We have learned that if we don't have a plan in place to draw and keep visitors, then we shouldn't be surprised when first time visitors quickly turn into last time visitors. It is our responsibility as followers of Christ to show hospitality to everyone that God brings us.

Some people may grow uncomfortable with treating the church like a business, but businesses actually do a better job than churches of showing hospitality. Think of a restaurant with great service. It takes a team. The Host or Maître D who shows you where to sit and makes recommendations to make you feel comfortable and show you how the restaurant works. Then, there's the waiter who guides you through the meal, and serves. After the meal, there's a busser who cleans up tables. In the back, there's the cook or chef, and the janitor, and maybe a manager/owner. This team is working to provide great service so that you will come back.

Hosanna is similar. We have hosts who greet guests to the sanctuary, show them refreshments, or the restrooms, or where to bring their children should they decide to show their independence. We have elders who guide our guests through the service: where to sit or how communion is shared. We also have "bussers" who follow up with guests immediately following our worship service to make sure first-timers receive their free gift and meet people of similar backgrounds. The next day our first-timers receive a follow up card in the mail, where they learn more about Hosanna and that we'd love to have them back as second-time guests. In the back, we have an efficient staff to make it all work, to provide great service so that you will come back and help us assimilate more guests. As Mark Twain said "You will be more disappointed by the things that you didn't do, than by the ones you did do. The secret to getting ahead is getting started." Let's get started.

### **Approval of Minutes**

### **Open Issues**

1.Purpose Area Metrics:

2. Purpose Area Vision Retreat Focus Items:

Grow Youth Group: This is going well although more adult volunteers are needed. It was discussed that volunteers are best recruited face to face( or asked in person).

Professionally led Mental Health Support Groups: AA group will start meeting here on Thursday evenings. Evangelism using bulletin board and brochures are recommended.

3. Church Rebranding/ Hwy 190 Visual Changes/ Marketing

4. Pastor's Report:

Bethlehem Lutheran Church has asked for donation to help fund an anti-racism conference coming up. Council declines to give \$1000 requested since there is no time to gather info about the costs/planning involved in the event. What Do We Believe in ELCA? Sessions going well.
