Grace to you and peace,

Friends, sometimes I try to get a chuckle during a sermon by saying, "We've never done it this way before." Sometimes I try to prep our congregation for a new hymn or process by saying, "Now, remember, this is an experiment." These are helpful in times of change, but man, oh man. We have never done this. Never have I ever been through a time such as this.

As this time of sheltering at home lengthens and the sense of isolation for all of us deepens, we want to offer a continuing word of encouragement and support. We recognize this is an unprecedented season in which to do ministry. Never before has everyone had to shift the way in which ministry is done in such a dramatic way and under such an urgent timeframe.

I try to see things from a perspective of God's abundance and I am usually pretty optimistic. I am so proud of the ministry of our congregation during these new times. I **pray God's continuing love, encouragement, and strength all around you.** Our council had stepped up by making phone calls. You small group leaders have been encouraged to check on the people in their small groups. I personally, encourage you to reach out to friends and neighbors, Hosanna members and others, and check in during these stressful times. We are ministering to each other. Powerful stuff.

I must tell you how proud I am of our members. We are truly proclaiming the Love of God to all people. In the midst of the Corona-cation, our sanctuary revamp continues. A new online women's began. Our teens group are having amazing discipleship opportunities using Instagram. Hosanna Hot Meals is blossoming in this time of need. From 50 or 60 meals on a Monday night to over 200 meals! We have also partnered with another local feeding ministry, sharing our kitchen and feeding another 300 people on Wednesdays. Friends, from the quietness of my own home-office, I am beaming (Continued)

A pastor/friend of mine wrote recently that this time will be the catalyst for positive movements in the church. I am witnessing these changes on a daily basis. We are proclaiming!

Of course, there are still questions. We have many new skills to learn. Here are some things I know for sure!

- Easter is coming! Although April 12, we will not meet together in our sanctuary the date doesn't matter. The first Sunday we can gather again, whatever the date, we will Celebrate Easter!
- Online worship will get better! This is new for us but we are making improvements each week and it is reaching people.
- We are reaching people! Last week almost a THOUSAND people worshiped online at some point during the week and when I checked last almost TWENTY-THOUSAND people had seen one Hosanna Hot Meal post, including Fox News 8 who came and did a story for TV. Lake 94.7 did an interview later in the week. Friends be proud of our congregation!
- We still need your financial support. As our ministries expand to meet the needs of our community, there are increased expenses. Our social media presence has invited others to share their financial gifts as well. If you are able, please continue your regular giving.
- There are a lot more questions. Camp, graduation, worship music, staffing. We are working together and asking for God's vision and guidance. We don't have all the answers, but we are moving forward with God's mission in mind!
- Lastly, Thank you for sharing your gifts. **Thank you for using your talents to meet the needs of your neighbor.**If you have a need, please let us know so that we may be God's hands and feet to you.

Paul writes in Ephesians,

"We pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you may be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit and that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love."







Hosanna Lutheran Church Council Meeting February 17, 2020

The regular meeting of the Hosanna Lutheran Church Council was called to order at 7 pm on February 17, 2020 by Brad Phillips. Pastor Jay opened with prayer.

Julie Brown, Ashley Burbank, Steve Beene, Brad Phillips, Teresa Abram, George Michell, Sandy Nieto and Pastor Jay Grave were present. Rob Rhea was present on speakerphone.

Open Issues

Transition to New Council(what are the items we need to ensure we present to them or complete to ensure a smooth transition to the next council)

- Need concrete plan for better vision communication to congregation
- Plan for better volunteer engagement
- Plan to get people to 101, 201, 301, 401 classes
- To -do spreadsheet assignments
- Make formal the separation of duties between exec council and full council
- Updating council job descriptions (recruiting council members with the skills necessary for each position
- Coaching and training on volunteer leadership techniques

Executive's Report

- Vision Retreat 2019 focus items: Youth Program, Community Assistance, HLC Operating System
- Nominated candidates for council and nominating committee
- Council: Madeline Tedesco, Sara Kezar, Jay Bearden, Doug Burbank, Kim Thompson
- Nominating Committee: Marc Reed, Michael Slye, Jeanette Mayo, Ryan Dwyer
- Reviewed election procedures (3 members to tally votes will be assigned by VP)
- Annual meeting (March 8) agenda review. President Brad will be out of town so
- VP Julie will run the meeting

Calendar Review, BPA's

- Worship: Bob Busfield presentation re: stage revamp. Bob brought drawings of proposed stage revamp design and costs. He does not recommend covering stage with ceramic, Acadian flooring doesn't recommend wood or vinyl since the piano getting moved around could damage it. He is also working with Carl Hilt re: the stained-glass project and has built a temporary frame for it. Steve motioned to approve Bob's plan for a slightly larger stage, George seconded. All were in favor. Motion passed.
- Electrical work for sanctuary has started.
- Nursing area in sanctuary has been set up.
- Evangelism: Bob Busfield spoke about design for a cross to place on church grounds near Hwy 190. He recommends metal 7x12 ft painted white. George motioned to approve 2 crosses; Julie seconded. All were in favor. Motion passed.
- Ash Wednesday, Easter Egg Hunt, Brunch plans discussed.
- Discipleship: Lent activities include on-line devotionals on Wednesdays. Council invited to participate. Youth fundraiser Easter Bunny Brunch planned. FCF is not being well attended and may need to be changed.
- Fellowship: Crawfish Boil planned in spring April 26(Sun) after 10:30 service. Steve Beene's company will be paid to provide the crawfish. Tickets will be sold. No cook-off this year.
- Ministry: Rise Against Hunger Event in the summer

Pastor's Report

- AA group: Attendance is increasing, things are going well
- Hosanna Hot Meals: continues to offer free meals to community, good attendance
- Operating System: draft RSO (registered sex offender) covenant done
- Youth ministry: successful Muffuletta fundraiser raised over \$1000
- "How we read the Bible" ends Tuesday
- Wed. morning Bible study grows
- 2 weddings scheduled and 1 Hospital Baptism so far this year
- Briefly discussed the legal issues facing Jenn Thompson and Peter Torrey. We will continue to pray for them and their families.

Financial Items

\$116,000 over budget per Brad and Rob's spreadsheets. Some items may not be recorded correctly, and it may be that we are actually \$60,000 over budget. Brad, Rob and Janice are working on this. Rob will wait until he is sure things are correctly accounted for before issuing the financial report.

Investments: General Fund: \$10,000 Wells Fargo; \$10,000 CD; \$5000 Stock

Building fund: \$50,000 CD Gulf Bank:\$100,000 Managed Assets

Church Council Meeting Feb. 17, 2020 Continued:

- Checking account \$120,000 (interest bearing about \$400/month).\$ 100,000 of this is designated for building fund.
- Rob Rhea recommended no unbudgeted spending in 2020 and looking for ways to cut costs since 2020 projected budget is \$20,000 in the red.
- Once financials are finished and accurate, at that first meeting with new members we need to look at budget vs. actual to make sure we make adjustments as we feel necessary.
- A payment for Youth transportation for 2019 will be approved from the Scrip account

New Business

- Steve motioned to approve the minutes from the January meeting and Teresa seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.
- Full Council meeting will be changed to Sunday March 15, 2020 following the New Council Retreat. At this meeting, officer elections will take place and council handbook will be reviewed.

George motioned to adjourn meeting and Steve seconded. All were in favor . Meeting was adjourned at 9:27 pm. Brad closed with prayer.
