Was there a time in your life when you needed a *redo*, a *restart*, a *reboot*? Maybe you are a fan of the turn-it-off-turn-it-on-again method of tech *repair*? Maybe your golf swing just isn't what it used to be? Maybe your grandkid outran your throwing arm and you want to give it one more chance. Doing something over, *redoing* takes advantage of hindsight and *reflection*.

This past 6 weeks or so, our Hosanna council with your help has been *re-evaluating* our strategic planning area. The SWOT surveys made sure your voice was heard in the evaluation process and very soon we will learn of the *renewed* direction of our faith family. *Respect* to tradition and passion to proclaim God's love will continue to lead us on God's journey.

Many of you have had the opportunity to get to know him already. He will be preaching about *renewal* on Sunday, as I will be taking a few days of relaxation and refreshment.

On the night of the 17th, we are adding a new worship event, a Night of Praise. Join in a time of singing and prayer starting at 7pm on Saturday evening. Heather and friends will lead us in music and song, this would be a fantastic time to bring a friend.

Redirection, is the theme on the 18th as we consider our own congregation and our long-term vision for ministry in Mandeville and beyond. 



As we enter into October, I can't help but think how far we've come over the last few months. Since the world shut down in March, we have created almost 100 daily devotionals for teens; met the kids where there at through additional social media accounts; created a Spotify account with playlists for teens to have wherever they go; paired all of these additions with new policies; held a virtual Confirmation Retreat; still managed to assist with Virtual VBS; helped to make the first planter box for the Faith Garden; and have now, started to gather regularly in person on Monday Nights! It's amazing to see how much we've done. There's a saying that's been going around – "you are not just "working from home." You are "at your home, during a crisis, trying to work." In keeping that in mind, it is even more impressive!

Although our sense of normalcy is growing (especially with all our October events coming up!), it is still important to remember that we are still trying to work during a crisis. School has begun, and my feeling and what I hear from our Teens is how overwhelmingly hard and stressful it is. For this semester, the teens will be studying Psalm 119 through Instagram, the first verse states, "blessed are those whose ways are blameless, who walk according to the law of the Lord". What our study will show us about this one verse is that no one is blameless on their own. We are imperfect and fail much, which is why we need Jesus. This verse is a reminder that it is impossible to work during a crisis on our own – we need Jesus, and my hope is that all we've done and will continue to do for the Hosanna Teens Program will allow

Teens to see that.

Indianapolis: Practically Paris

I have arrived in Indianapolis! ... Walt, wasn't I supposed to go to France?

As I mentioned this summer, in the case that France's borders were still closed by my report date, my team would temporarily work from Cru's regional office in Indianapolis. This situation has come to pass. We are still working remotely for the NAME Office in France, just from about 4000 miles away. Quite the virtual commute!

Despite some missed expectations, our temporary placement in Indy has been a blessing in many ways. My team has taken time to bond without facing culture shock yet, we are able to continue studying French together, and we are still able to reap the benefits of going into a physical office.

The Lord has shown up in some incredible ways in the transition to Indy. Halfway into August, my team decided to temporarily relocate to Indy. Over the following 3 weeks, we found great apartments, secured transportation to the city, and had enough furniture donated to fully furnish three apartments.

I don't know how long I will be in Indianapolis. While this can be scary, I see it as an invitation to trust in the Lord with my situation. The Lord has already provided in so many ways, and I trust that He will provide a way for my team to do the work to which He has called us.

The team is all ready to apply for our visas once the French consulates begin handing out accepting applications again. As soon as we can, we will be relocating to the NAME office in France so we can do our work most efficiently and effectively. Pray with me that the French borders would open soon, and that our visa application process would go smoothly!



HOSANNA COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES August 17, 2020

Teresa Abram called meeting to order at 7 pm. Those in attendance were Teresa Abram, Pastor Jay Grave, George Michell, Kim Dauzat-Thompson, Ashley Burbank, Doug Burbank, Steve Beene, Rob Rhea and Sarah Kezar. Guests include Scott Watson. A quorum was established. Pastor Jay opened with prayer.

Steve Beene introduced Scott Watson to talk about starting a Hosanna F.A.I.T.H. (Food Always in the Home) Garden. The purpose is to equip people to have food available year-round from the garden. The produce will be used for HHM and God's Unchanging Hands clients. The preschool will participate and will include in the curriculum, the youth group can fundraise by selling a box of vegetables and some items will be sold to restaurants. 20 garden boxes (at \$160 each) are needed, and are asking for sponsors to pay for this. So far 10 boxes have been sponsored. Rob motioned to approve \$3170 to start the FAITH garden and George seconded. All were in favor, motion passed.

President's Report:

Preschool planning team: Scott Watson is working on a business plan for Madisonville campus, Pastor Jay will check with Synod on applying for the \$90,000 grant.

Building quotes pending for replacement of preschool portables and kitchen expansion

SWOT: Keep working on lists!

Pastor's Report:

Explained how we will use our Master Planning Arrow. Results from SWOT analysis will help guide our planning for future. The goal is to provide an opportunity for the disengaged members to be heard and re-engage, while charting a course to reach out to our community.

Focus on growing outreach ministries

Explore additional revenue streams (Parent Pod for virtual school could rent rooms upstairs)

Empower volunteers to face tech and cultural changes

Pastor and Elizabeth plan to make a "pass-through" donation with their personal money to Pacific Lutheran University which will contribute to scholarship for daughter Isabel

Sept 20 or Sept 27 Jason West will present/preach during Sunday service on International Justice Ministry which is having success in saving people from the slave/sex slave traffic business

VP: Raise team going ok

Secretary: Sarah motioned to accept minutes; Kim seconded. All were in favor. Working to get quotes to connect to parish water. Working on updating member list.

Worship (George): In person worship averaging 40-50 people. Online FB live service continues.

Discipleship (Ashley): Rooted Pilot Program completed. H.I.S. Work Days were a success, with 30 volunteers. 100 extra sanctuary chairs were donated to Bethlehem Church. 2 couches and a desk were donated to Habitat for Humanity. There are a few more projects to get preschool ready. Recommend painting the portables. Consider mid-week Fun Work Fun and Exclamation rather than Sunday nights.

Ministry(Steve): Hosanna Hot Meals has served 8,376 meals at no cost to the church! 25 members in the HHM group are active. Casserole Club and other members are providing desserts. Short term needs (freezer space needed. Walk-in cooler and freezer space needed to accept donated frozen foods. 3 door freezers for \$3500 is good idea. Long term needs are New Kitchen/Storage Area/Dining Hall. Quote for metal building to house this is \$28,000(\$24/sq. foot). Commercial kitchen equipment estimate is \$35,000. Charles Stone is applying for grants to cover this equipment cost. Discussed need for "safe-serve" guidelines to people working in kitchen. Rob motioned to buy \$3500 freezer using HHM money in account. This was seconded by George. Motion passed

Fellowship (Kim): Hosanna Chats on Zoom after Sunday service has minimal success (0-3 participants). Propose Labor Day to-go Picnic or Tailgate after Sunday Service or perhaps an October event "Easter in October" brunch. Proposal for women's event Joyce Meyer streaming program Friday Sept 11 at 7 p.m.

Treasurer Report (Doug): Member giving is down. Working on drafting a By-law for endowment for youth to guide how money is used.

Old Business

Office hour proposal for Phase III: will review proposal and discuss next meeting.

New Business

Parent Pod Idea with Tutor Dr.

Planning Arrow Discussion to map out short- and long-term goals

Planning Arrow Retreat

Rob motioned to adjourn meeting and George seconded. All were in favor. Meeting was adjourned at 10:03 pm.
