Grace to you and peace,

In the fourth chapter of the Gospel of St. Luke, Jesus unrolls a scroll while sitting in the synagogue and reads words the hometown folks gathered would have known. The words, from the Prophet Isaiah, were words that had brought hope to the children of Israel for generations. Isaiah promises that God has a long-range vision, a strategic plan. This plan, this vision, is a good-news vision: release to captives, physical healing, freedom from economic and political oppression.

Jesus rolls up this Godly promise and announces that He is the promise coming into being. What an amazing proclamation! The love of God, made manifest in our savior Jesus Christ, is breaking into the world to bring Good News.

God's plan, God's vision, is good news to us even today. We still have poor, blind, and oppressed people all around us. All you need to do is flip on the news to see strife in our world and even as close as our own neighborhoods. The Christian church has been a beacon, a refuge, to hurting people for two-thousand years and continues to do so. Today, friends, Jesus brings this good news into being and you have been gifted and invited to participate! We are the hands and feet of Jesus.

This month, during our Sunday services, we will study these words of Isaiah and Jesus. We will be thinking together about how, in small steps, we proclaim this heavenly promise of God's love in very real ways. We will explore our own unique giftedness and the particular needs around us. We will dive deeply into the Isaiah tradition and we will wonder together what it means that Jesus shares this powerful profession in his own hometown. As a congregation, we continue to worship together on campus and online, small groups are gathering together, our council is praying through the data collected in our SWOT. In September, the council will meet in retreat to put words to Hosanna's part of God's long-term plan. Children are headed to preschool and back to school and we all look toward the good news of a familiar routine.

On the 20th of this month, Hosanna will have a special guest from the International Justice Ministry, sharing a message of hope for modern day slaves around the world. Keep an eye to our social media for more information on Jason West and IJM. You will be invited to view a video or two and join together in prayer and home bible study.

As we continue to navigate our way through these days of the coronavirus, I look forward to seeing you physically or virtually participating in Hosanna's ministries. We begin the month in phase 2, with in-person worship for 50 people practicing social distancing in our sanctuary. This service is Sunday at 9 am. Of course, the hope is that, with safety in mind, we are able to increase worship capacity as Louisiana is able to move into phase 3 and beyond. Our online campus worships together on Facebook at 10:30 am. Please share the link for this worship as a simple act of evangelism. As plans develop, we can take comfort in knowing God's plan is coming into existence even now. God's blessings to you and our congregation as we proclaim the love of God to all people, one small step at a time!

Sundays at 10:30 am! What! Can't join us online? Come join us in person, at 9:00 am.

- We are asking that everyone please wear a mask.
- We will have greeters at the door that will take your temperature and give you hand sanitizer.
- We won't have coffee or the tables in the Narthex.
- Members will immediately go to the sanctuary and find a place to sit in the chairs that will be spaced throughout the sanctuary. We will be able to have 140 people in the sanctuary for the service. If we have more than this number, then we will have to utilize the Narthex for worship space as well.
- The Nursery will not be open, and we will not have the kids' bags available yet.
- Offering plates will be kept at the back of the Sanctuary rather than passed down each row.
- We will have music, but we will ask that the congregation not sing at this time.
- Communion will be held at the end of the service. There will be little disposable cups of juice and wafers available for you to pick up as you leave the Sanctuary.



- VP REPORT: Sarah motioned to accept minutes of last meeting; Rob seconded. All were in favor.

SECRETARY REPORT: Bylaws and Constitution revisions ready to be presented in March 2021 Annual Meeting for congregation approval. Revisions to how we elect our council positions were discussed. Will change Nominating Team to submit candidates to run for specific position on council

WORSHIP (GEORGE): Continue to adapt to Online Services

MINISTRY (Steve): Hosanna Hot Meals: 1683 meals over last 4 weeks. November 2019-July 9, 2020 6,563 meals served. God's Helping Hands with Pam has surpassed 4,500 meals. There has been no cost to Hosanna as all expenses have been donated so far. Hot Meals Team (Louann Stone, Charles Stone, Mike Slye, John Hood, Nicole Gunn and Steve Beene) and Sack Lunch Team (Phyllis Giffen, Laura Sanchez and Dana Reed) are working well. Casserole Club is providing desserts. TREASURER REPORT(Doug):

- Giving is down approx. \$50,000 from 2019 so far. Building and maintenance expenses are up. Fortunately, the \$80,000 Payroll Protection Act loan/grant is offsetting these. A letter will be sent to congregation this summer to communicate about this.
- Discussed investing \$25,000 of the \$36,000 in the Scrip account into an Endowment with the ELCA Foundation where it will earn interest. This will yield money to fund Youth Program in Perpetua. Rob motioned to start such endowment; George seconded. All were in favor.
- There is \$11,000 in a designated or restricted fund for Mwanna Mission. Sandy motioned to gift this fund to the ELCA Mwana Mission, and Sarah seconded. All were in favor.

OLD BUSINESS : Not discussed here

NEW BUSINESS

- Office staff has requested a Ring doorbell (\$99) that could be monitored by office staff and preschool staff via an app on a cell phone, either on-site or remotely. Motion to approve this request was made. 4 for, 1 against, 2 abstained . Motion passed.
- Plumbing and water pressure problems need repair, plumber has been lined up for this week
- Kitchen update possibilities
