Dear Hosanna Family:

In the Old Testament book of 1st Samuel, the seventh chapter, the prophet Samuel is on a mountain praying. The Israelites are doing their thing and God is displeased. He speaks to the people and says something like, "If you are going to claim to be my people, then you really have to act like it."

The people are afraid, the Philistines attack, the people repent, and God saves the day. "Then Samuel took a stone and set it up between Mizpah and Shen. He named it Ebenezer". Ebenezer means stone of help, saying, "Thus far, the Lord has helped us." –1 st Samuel 7:12

I often think about that Ebenezer. An Ebenezer provides a reminder to everyone of an event that served to change a course; like the way Ebenezer Scrooge provides an example for us all each Christmas. You can bet that when the people of Israel saw Samuel's Ebenezer, they were remembered. They might have considered where they were before and what transpired, how they reacted, but certainly they were reminded again how God saved the day.

I write you today to announce my resignation as the Pastor of Hosanna Lutheran Church.

In the nearly four years I have been your pastor, we have faced scary things together. Pandemics, politics, and changing staff just to name a few. We have discussed in groups and in private, past hurts in this congregation, we have considered our community and our denominational identities, we have battled some formidable adversaries and God continues to save.

As I reflect upon this time of ministry, I erect an Ebenezer. One that will remind me of a family of faith, who in the midst of a global pandemic increased their service and giving to the community, starting new collaborations and programs. I will cherish a celebration of the 10,000th meal shared with our hungry neighbors. I will look back fondly upon a council unwilling to maintain the status quo but who changed personnel and policy to overcome a tax debt and loss of nearly \$100,000 of congregationally given money and then worked for more transparency regarding funds. I will smile and remember how students in our youth ministry were so proud to participate in the choreography at the National Youth Gathering and then sat teary eyed as the Gospel of Jesus was presented in their own language. I will laugh and roll my eyes a little at the incredible amount of time invested in interviewing new staff; including office staff (twice), ministry staff, musical leadership, groundskeeping and custodial staffing.

I will recall the Holy conversations with you, prayers shared in hospital rooms and living rooms. I will remember smiling and masked faces worshipping Jesus together and I will of course be reminded by this Ebenezer of the new siblings in Christ I have been able to minister with here at Hosanna. I am thankful for your partnership.

My last Sunday at Hosanna will be November 15, 2020. Shortly after that the Grave family will be moving to Greece, where we will be living on a sailboat and exploring the Mediterranean Sea.

God's blessings on your continued ministry proclaiming the Love of God to All People,

Join our Hosanna Family online Sundays at 10:30 am! What! Can't join us online? Come join us in person, at 9:00 am.

- We are asking that everyone please wear a mask.
- We will have greeters at the door that will take your temperature and give you hand sanitizer.
- We won't have coffee or the tables in the Narthex.
- Members will immediately go to the sanctuary and find a place to sit in the chairs that will be spaced throughout the sanctuary. We will be able to have 140 people in the sanctuary for the service. If we have more than this number, then we will have to utilize the Narthex for worship space as well.





Hosanna Lutheran Church Council Meeting

September 28, 2020

Teresa Abram called meeting to order at 7 pm . A quorum was established.

Members Present: Teresa Abram, Sandy Nieto, Steve Beene, Doug Burbank, Pastor Jay, Rob Rhea, George Michell

and Kim Dauzat-Thompson **Opening Prayer:** Pastor Jay

President's Report:

- SWOT: Nathan will share results with Council on Sunday October 4th at 11:00 am. Lunch will be provided, then will work on the planning arrow until 3 pm.
- Hosanna's Homeless Neighbors Policy: Rob motioned to accept; Steve seconded. All were in favor.
- Grants: HHM has several in the application phase
- Encouraging others to volunteer: Pause, Ponder, Pray
- Delegating: When someone is willing and able to do something, give them a task and be sure to thank them.

Pastor's Report:

- Hosanna FAITH gardens are being assembled by hard working congregation members and members are sharing their resources to produce 40 raised gardens.
- Hosanna Hot Meals provided hundreds of sack lunches to residents of Lake Charles. Truckloads of relief supplies
 were also sent in collaboration with God's Unchanging Hands, Grace Lutheran, Lutheran disaster relief, First Lutheran and St. Paul Lutheran.
- Preschool began
- Youth meeting together for fellowship and service with discipleship done online.
- Small groups are meeting, Council and Small Group leaders are invited to participate in the next Rooted program to be led by Elizabeth Grave on Tuesday nights.
- Rooted discipleship program will provide the foundation for spiritual growth campaign
- In person worship continues at 9 am. with safety precautions. Persons especially vulnerable to Covid-19 virus are still encouraged to worship from home online. As attendance at 9 am service increases will add 10:30 in person service.
- Girls Night In was a success. It included fellowship in person with social distancing and an online program streamed in.
- SWOT analysis is being tabulated. Nathan Hoffman will present to council October 4, 2020.
- Divorce Care began meeting in-person. We are collaborating with the program at Church of the King as they move to an online program, giving folks a choice of in-person at Hosanna, or online at Church of the King.
- Recovery ministries are meeting and eager to open up to more people.
- Pastor has had 8 in-office pastoral care conversations and telephone and zoom meetings.
- Know.Grow.Follow Podcast with Adam Moore is reaching millennials.
- In collaboration with Florida Parishes Human Services Authority, a drive-in movie on suicide will occur in our parking lot on Tuesday night October 27th. All St. Tammany residents are invited.
- Oct 11, Pastor Jay out of town. Pastor Jarret Banks will preside.

VP Report:

- Janice's son in-law died of ALS a week ago, survived by wife and 3 young children, and in lieu of sending flowers we will give gift card for a Japanese Magnolia tree which daughter would like. Perhaps H.I.S. can help plant.
- Teresa would like VP to start to navigate communications and media.

Church Council Meeting September 28, 2020 Continued:

Secretary Report:

- Rob motioned to approve meeting minutes from last meeting, George seconded. All were in favor.
- Sandy was unable to find a water company that would service our property.

PURPOSE AREA REPORTS:

Worship (George):

• Recommends we add 2nd service at 10:30 to accommodate people who don't want to come at 9. Steve suggested we find a way to schedule something for the young kids on Sunday morning so we may need to change the second worship time. Will hold off on adding second worship for now but hope to soon as Covid situation allows.

Discipleship (Ashley):

- Ashley not present, but discussion ensued about the dis-connect between the preschool and the church. How can we get more of the preschool kids and families to come to church? Flyers with church activities on them are being sent home in the kids folders already. Discussed the Board of Directors of the Preschool. Council would like more church members to be on the board.
- Need volunteers for the Property Committee. Currently, just a few people are doing the repairs, and they need help.

Ministry (Steve):

- Hosanna Hot Meals has been sending 400 sack lunches for Lake Charles for last 3 Tuesdays and 100 sack lunches
 to Samaritan Center every Tuesday. HHM has been serving around 250 hot meals a week also.
- HHM is reaching 10,000 meals
- 20 Faith Boxes are assembled and awaiting dirt. Need sponsors to do 20 more.
- Grants: #1: getting our USDA number and #2: getting free fruit trees.
- Working on irrigation, electrical and well to run the irrigation system(Bob Busfield and Charles Stone)
- Future plans: Christmas lights in the garden area, with nativity scene, youth group selling refreshments

Fellowship (Kim):

- Women's night went well and participants requested to do it again, perhaps in November.
- Hosanna Chats didn't have participation, so stopped.
- Baby Shower for Grace on Nov 1.
- Christmas Party: What do we want to do? Not a full meal but perhaps focus on musical event.

Evangelism (Rob):

• Discussed location of Prayer Garden may not have enough shade

Teresa suggested getting together a kit of posters, banners, handouts to have available to use at events outside of church where a table can be set up for event-goers to browse.

Treasurer Report:

- Doug presented guidelines for setting up an Endowment Committee and the Hosanna Youth Endowment Fund. The committee would consist of a Chairman (not a member of Exec Council), the Treasurer of Council, and three other members of the congregation(not members of the Exec Council) to be appointed by Church Council. Actions of the committee must be agreed to by at least three of the voting members. Rob motioned that Exec Council set up the Endowment Committee and Steve seconded. All were in favor. Recommend notifying Julie Brown, Vicki Entzel and Kathy Colbert to thank them on their work to establish endowment for the SCRIP fund to benefit youth activities.
- Council needs to meet to work on annual budget.

Church Council Meeting September 28, 2020 Continued:

OLD BUSINESS

- Fundraising: Sponsors, Grants, Income such as recitals
- Security on Campus: Light bulbs in parking lot replaced, so they should all be working. Security company came out to look at security for the preschool.(motion sensors lights, cameras)
- Budget Meeting needs to be scheduled before meeting in November with congregation
- Pastor's Sabbatical on the back burner, but keep in mind for budget meeting

NEW BUSINESS

Planning Arrow Retreat Oct 4

Rob motioned to adjourn meeting; George seconded. All were in favor. Meeting adjourned at 8:30 pm.
