I <u>feel</u> his *love* in warm cuddles with my kids during movie nights, cool crisp air on the deck while spending time with Alex for morning coffee, and in long anticipated hugs from family far away.

I pray that in this month of reflection and anticipation you find God's *love* everywhere you look, hear, smell, taste, and touch; as that will lead us into every new day.

Church Council

Earlier this year, the church council solicited feedback from the congregation by sending out a SWOT survey. A SWOT survey is intended to ascertain the Strengths, Weakness, Opportunities, and Threats of an organization. The following paragraphs summarize the results that were received from members of the congregation. From the time of the survey, circumstances have changed with the departure of Pastor Jay, but the council is actively following up on these results to improve areas that are weaknesses, reinforce areas that are strengths, pursue intriguing opportunities, and mitigate and address threats.

Response Numbers:

A SWOT survey was sent to all members of the congregation (about 500). Forty-seven (47) responses were received. Of those 47, twenty-nine (29) have been members for more than 10 years, and the responses were evenly split between the first and second service. Forty (40) of the 47 respondents are involved in one or more ministries and 24 are members of a Small Group. Responses for the preferred form of communication varied broadly: emails (29), texts (22), phone (16), social media (13), Sunday announcements (12), newsletter (9), Church Builder (2), message in a bottle (0).

Results Summary:

The survey identified several areas of **strength** that can be grouped into three broad categories: people, welcoming, and outreach. Respondents emphasized the strong sense of community, camaraderie, and friendliness amongst members. A sense of family was mentioned frequently. The people of Hosanna persevere despite problems, are inclusive, and have an established community of faith. Long term relationships and fellowship are also strengths. Hosanna is very welcoming to people. Visitor and members alike are welcomed at the door and the atmosphere is friendly and inviting to all. Another strength is Hosanna's outreach. Several programs within Hosanna were cited including the feeding ministries, Quilters, Hosanna-In-Service, and the ministry groups. The council is committed to continue supporting these areas of strength.

The survey also identified several areas of **weakness**, specifically in the areas of communication, leadership, liberal policies, dwindling membership, and youth. Communication (lack of) was mentioned frequently as an area that needs improvement. A resistance to change, an unwillingness to address problems, and an absence of volunteerism was cited. Respondents referred to a lack of communication with church staff and a limited connection with the younger generation. Leadership was another area of weakness. Leadership was perceived as ineffective and unwelcoming of conservative views, social media posts were "off-putting, and there was a lack of direction. The survey mentioned policies of the Pastor and the ELCA as a weakness, seemingly to focus on left-leaning views and as a cause for membership departures. Finally, respondents alluded to the shrinking membership and youth as areas to work on. The council has discussed these weaknesses and is actively addressing these in the planning of 2021 activities and in the call for a new pastor.

Hosanna has many exciting **opportunities** to pursue and programs to continue. The survey identified opportunities in the areas of community need, feeding, meeting space, and small groups. The largest group of respondents mentioned community needs as an area of opportunity. These areas include our current programs (Faith gardening program and Hosanna In Service) and opportunities to pursue such as outreach to those more vulnerable or who are struggling, outreach to older adults and men, growth and improvement of the pre-school, and expansion of the Casserole Club. Another area of opportunity is our food ministry and Hosanna Hot Meals. As well, the survey suggested various means to utilize our space such as renting space to outside groups and inviting other congregations to worship. Lastly, small groups could be expanded and could include youth groups. The council is eager to examine and exploit these areas of opportunity that have been identified by the membership.

Hosanna also faces significant **threats**. One of the primary threats that the survey mentioned was member discontent. A common complaint was divisiveness over politics, beliefs and church doctrine. Other grievances included a lack of tolerance, close-mindedness, bullying and the inability to apologize. Some mentioned a feeling of club mentality and power-playing. Another main area of concern is the drop in church membership. A few respondents cited the threat from other churches, and some mentioned our building/infrastructure as a liability. The council is keenly aware of the threats imposed on HLC and is discussing means to mitigate divisiveness and to increase our membership in 2021.

The church council appreciates the feedback received from the 2020 SWOT survey. The council is committed to incorporating results of this survey so Hosanna can pursue its mission, "To proclaim the love of God to all people, so that they may know Jesus Christ, grow in faith, and follow Christ." President's Report

- Hosanna 2040 visions from council members have been collected and will help with Planning Arrow
- Security system for preschool part of campus, quote (without cameras) \$1900. Will consider once budget is discussed.
- Planning Arrow discussion in November meeting
- Kickoff: Consider Open House possible in spring

Pastor's Report

- Successes include completion and analysis of SWOT surveys, "It's Complicated" group meeting to discuss racial inequality, Wednesday morning Bible study of Acts and "Night of Praise" music .
- Pastor's submitted his resignation letter. It was read by council and discussed at length. Pastor's last day will be Nov 15, 2020. Council will be guided by Pastor Tracy Schultz who is assistant to the bishop to obtain an interim pastor and call a new pastor. Council hopes to have a shorter term for interim pastor than we did with Pastor Paul. A call committee will need to be formed with interested members.

- Meeting minutes: Sarah motioned to accept the last month's minutes and Steve seconded. All were in favor.
- Tammany Utilities working up a quote for us in the next 3 weeks for connection to water and sewer,

- Women's night in scheduled Nov 6th

Treasurer

- Congregational Budget Meeting on Nov 8. Council needs to have budget ready by then.
- \$75,000 projected shortfall projected for 2020 (Income minus expenses).
- Member giving has significantly declined this year. There is \$144,000 shortfall from actual member giving compared to what was budgeted for 2020.
- Lengthy, line by line, discussion of budget. Some expenditures were decreased or cut. Budget will be presented to the congregation and will be voted on November 8, 2020 at the annual Congregational Budget Meeting.

Rob motioned to adjourn meeting and George seconded. All were in favor. Meeting adjourned at 9:20 pm.
