Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. Cast me not away from your presence, and take not your Holy Spirit from me. (Psalm 51:10-11)

February 2021

I cannot read these words from Psalm 51 without humming a tune or bursting into song. These words bring back memories of Sunday worship when I was a child and youth. I grew up in a small Lutheran congregation in central Illinois and every Sunday we would sing an Offertory based on these words from Psalm 51, "Create in me a clean heart, O God...renew a right spirit within me...cast me not away from your presence...take not your Holy Spirit from me." After the sermon and as the offerings were brought forward to be placed on the altar, we would rise to sing. I remember that on good days my voice would burst forth with gusto, a genuine commitment flowing forth, a deep desire to be renewed and my heart made right.

Of course I often knew I needed to be cleaned up! Some weeks my life was a mess. Maybe it didn't look like that on the outside but that's how I felt on the inside. I needed to be renewed! For in the preceding week my heart had been anything but clean and my spirit anything but rightly aligned with God's love and care for others. I knew I was in need of God's mercy and forgiveness. I had learned the Good News of God's love in Jesus Christ and I was painfully aware of my shortcomings. I trusted God still loved me even though I had said things I later regretted saying, and did things I later regretted doing. I knew I had hurt others or ignored someone or been swept away by what was popular instead of what was right and good. So Sunday was a time for once again hearing the words of absolution, "your sins are forgiven you." Sunday was a time to trust again the Good News of God's love and forgiveness in Jesus Christ, and start afresh. Sunday was a time to say, dear God, let's start again, "create in me a clean heart and renew my spirit."

We live in days that cry out for people with clean hearts and right spirits. I think of people who are struggling with personal issues, perhaps emotional stress or mental health. I think of how major issues of poverty, racial injustice and climate change beg to be addressed by people who care about all of God's creation. And I think daily of Hosanna Lutheran Church and the challenges before it, the decisions to be made and issues to sort out. What does a "clean heart and right spirit" look like?

I think of Jesus' words in Matthew 22 in response to the question about the greatest commandment. Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." And then he added, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Clean hearts burst forth with love for God and look for signs of God's presence in the people and places around us. Love for God always leads to love for neighbor.

Or I think of the words of the prophet Micah, "...what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with your God (Micah 6:8)." Clean hearts seek to see the world through the eyes of God. Rights spirits are led by the Holy Spirit into the way of Jesus, love and service to others.

Ash Wednesday is February 17, the beginning of the Lenten season. Psalm 51 is the appointed psalm for the day, inviting us to confess our sin and shortcomings, return to the Lord God, and receive God's empowering grace and mercy.

As we walk the 40 days of Lent and prepare to observe those events central to the Christian faith, I pray for the renewal of our faith, for healing and hope at Hosanna and throughout this Church and country. I pray the Holy Spirit will help our heart focused on the things of God and our spirits aligned with the will of God. I pray for a clean heart and a right spirit among us all.

Bebe Stich and her husband, Bill, were Charter Members of Hosanna Lutheran Church. Both were involved as the church grew and moved into its first physical building. Having been a church secretary Bebe logically fit into serving as a volunteer in the church office. She eventually stepped into that position when it became available but continued to work as a volunteer. She was even referred to as a "Church Angel" for all she did. Bebe loved greeting people as they entered church on Sunday. More than one person has said that she met us at the door and she is the reason we stayed. Her role as a staff member expanded and she ministered to the members of Hosanna through her willingness to listen and pray. She was busy with tasks but could always find time for kindness to others.

Bebe had an interest in sewing and had made quilts for her children. An interest in quilting grew and she wanted to share with others. She was inspired to start a quilting ministry at Hosanna. Because of her work she was not able to spend a lot of time with the quilt group but when she did stop in she brought quilts and smiles to share. She nurtured and encouraged the cooperative effort that evolved and helps this group work together. Later on a ministry for making Christmas stockings for The Samaritan Center's clients became a part of the quilters handmade items. Both of these ministries continue today.

The following are Bebe's own words from a Ministry Fair Flyer October 2011.

"I have watched this quilting group grow from four people to the size it is now...25 plus regular quilters. The group was formed in 1999 with some people doubting it would succeed because quilting was not a popular craft in the Mandeville/Covington area. Interest grew with ladies willing to teach themselves—no formal quilting instructions. Trial and error was the teacher. As time passed more skilled quilters joined the group and the inspiration to give all quilts away to people and organizations in need became the focal point.

The quilters supplied their own materials early on but now the group has received generous gifts of fabric from families whose loved one no longer quilts. The quilting group still relies on financial gifts to purchase quilt batting, tools such as threads, needles, identification labels and sewing machine upkeep. Most of all, they rely on the supportive prayers of individuals asking God

to bless their works and their gifts to others."

Her words show her humility in service and her gratefulness for those who participate and support the quilt ministry. She nurtured and encouraged the cooperative effort that evolved and still helps this group work together. Hosanna Lutheran Church and these ministries surely benefitted from Bebe's time among them. She is a good example of a person who lived a life of service to God and to people. It is true that

we will miss her, but we can say with love and blessed assurance


that our loss is God's gain.





Hosanna Lutheran Church Council Meeting

HOSANNA LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL DECEMBER 14, 2020

Meeting called to order by Teresa Abram at 7:05 pm.

A quorum was established. Those present were Teresa Abram, Sarah Kezar, Kim Dauzat-Thompson, Rob Rhea, George Michell, and Sandy Nieto. Guests present were Bob Busfield, Marilyn Boudreaux and Tara(preschool assistant).

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

- Pastor Jerry (interim pastor) will arrive Jan 20th. Contract for condo for he and his wife, Anita, was signed. He will preach on Jan 24th. Council has been having individual zoom meetings with him to get acquainted. List he was given of tasks council would like him to help us with includes: SWAT results, Planning arrow, Finances, and Preschool
- Benevolence we send to Synod is 9% of giving. Should we reduce the % due to our budget crunch? August was the last month paid to Synod. Teresa will check with Bishop to see if Synod would rather us reduce the % and be more able to pay monthly, or stay at 9% and be late on monthly payments.
- Kitchen: Grant Ella West Foundation pending.
- Preschool: Re: adding full day care for working parents to generate more revenue for the church, Marilyn states the preschool cannot extend hours more than 24 hrs./week because it is not certified by the state. The preschool is under the umbrella of the church. To be certified (if we wanted to extend hours) many upgrades (like new buildings) would be needed. Council would like more church members to be on the preschool governing board. Several members on the board are no longer members of the church. Council would like to see what it would take for preschool to get certified. Marilyn will provide this information.
- AV/Stream Team is getting tired and frustrated. Rob and Heidi Rhea have volunteered to help. More volunteers are needed.
- Bob Busfield: Fire Escape stairs by Sunday School classrooms need revising. They are not to code and although sound, are covered in mold and are slippery. Bob offers to take on this project. Cost around \$1500, Rob knows some ROTC students that could help with project doing community service.
- H.I.S. ministry: Jared who helps Pam with God's Unchanging Hands has identified people who are being served meals that need repairs to their homes. Bob will assess some of the projects and see if Hosanna In Service can help.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT: So far \$750 has been collected for staff gifts. Rob suggested it be divided equally between Grace, Janice, Katie and Marilyn.

SECRETARY REPORT:

- Sarah motioned that minutes be approved and George seconded. All were in favor.
- Sandy will arrange the first meeting of the nominating committee in early January. Members are Mike Slye, Jeanette Mayo and Marc Reed.

TREASURER REPORT: Doug out of town

PURPOSE AREA REPORTS:

- Worship (George): Attendance at 9 am service has been 57-65. Plan to resume 2 services after Pastor Jerry comes.
- Fellowship (Kim): Christmas event was a success. Considering welcome reception for Pastor Jerry.
- Evangelism (Rob): Gathering pictures for board. Logan was ill and unable to complete prayer garden, but will get it done before Christmas Eve.

Rob motioned we adjourn and George seconded. All were in favor. Meeting adjourned at 8:37 pm.
