Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen. (Ephesians 3:20-21)

Hosanna congregation received some hard news recently about the finances of the congregation. If you missed seeing the letter from the Rob Rhea, President of the Congregation, and me, contact the church office and we'll send you the letter. The bottom line is the congregation has some significant challenges ahead and perhaps some tough decisions to make. When I preached the Sunday after the letter was sent, I could see the worry, concern and heaviness of these matters written on the faces of people.

I guess that is why my heart has been drawn so strongly to the Second Lesson for that Sunday, the Ninth Sunday after Pentecost. Paul encourages the Ephesians in their life of prayer and boldly says God is "...able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine...(3:21)."

The whole letter, I noted in my sermon, is an encouragement in prayer. Paul encourages us to get down on our knees before God and lift up our hearts in praise and glory to our Father in heaven from whom all of us come (3:14). Paul prays the Ephesians (and us) may be strengthened in our inner being through the power of the Spirit so that we might be rooted and grounded in love (3:16-17). All this is that we might know and comprehend, with saints here on earth and in heaven above, what is the breadth and length, the height and depth of God's love for us in Jesus Christ (3:18).

While Hosanna Lutheran Church faces some significant challenges, there is a way forward in hope and expectation. The way forward begins with clarity about who we are and what God has called the congregation to do.

Often our first reaction in the midst of hard news is to either despair and do nothing or jump to quick answers and possible solutions. Paul says the first step is prayer, getting on our knees, perhaps literally, and seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Yes, the congregation has been dealt a severe blow with loss of members and financial resources. But the first step is being strengthened internally, in the soul of the congregation, by the power of the Holy Spirit. When we are clear about who we are, that God's love in Christ has brought us together and is stronger than anything in all creation, then the steps going forward will fall into place through prayer and conversation with one another.

Yes, Hosanna faces some significant challenges and perhaps some tough decisions. Yet the love of God in Christ surrounds, upholds and fills our life together. With that promise and assurance from God we can boldly and freely face the future. And we can join with Paul in giving praise and glory to God:

Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen.


#### **Treats for Troops**





#### AUGUST 2021 | HOSANNA HIGHLIGHTS

#### HOSANNA LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEEETING MINUTES JUNE 21, 2021

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:36 PM by Rob Rhea.

Members Present: Rob Rhea, Nathan Hoffman, Marc Reed, Rachael Moore, Amanda Watson, Steve Beene (via Zoom), Pastor Jerry Mansholt, Charles Stone

Manala - - - Manana

Members Absent: George Michell and Doug Burbank

Guest: Gayle Miller

Devotion: A devotion was led by Pastor Jerry based on Matthew 18:1-14.

Approval of Minutes: Moved (Marc), seconded (Amanda), and carried minutes from May 17, 2021, be approved as written.

Guest Presentation Regarding Pre-School Task Force Meetings: The task force has been reviewing what the pre-school provides to students using the document published by the ELEA Ministry to the Congregation: Self Study of Ministry and Relationships. Gayle reported that there are many positives that the school brings to the pre-school children and families: A big Christian commitment, Academically sound instruction covering physical, cognitive and affective learning experiences, Financially self-supportive, Positive ministry to children and families.

Questions have arisen within the school about where and how it fits in the Hosanna congregation .Some concerns voiced by the council are related to governance of the school, functions of the board members (sound oversight vs. blanket agreement with director), financial accountability to self and to the congregation, clear delineation of the reporting structure with regards to the church, all operational functions unclear.

Suggestions made by the council include: Place a Hosanna member on the school board; Have that person or the Director hold a place on the church council; Ensure that pre-school families feel welcome at Hosanna, receive newsletter, Hosanna Happenings, Facebook information; Possible look at offering before and after care if it would improve revenue stream and is needed for parents; Pastor sends a welcoming letter to the parents every August; School informs church about what activities pre-school is involved in requesting support as appropriate; Add item on registration forms regarding church affiliation of parents; Greater transparency in accounting practices, P&L accuracy, bank account status.

Pastor's Update: Report attached: Pastor noted the positive energy related to the Pre-school, FAITH Garden, Feeding Ministry, and Quilting Group. He recommends brainstorming with people in these groups and the congregation to identify possibilities for collaboration. He has noted a small number of people attending worship who are new to Hosanna or returning post-COVID.

A discussion was held about the proposed Leadership Retreat. His idea would be to have more people engaged in the planning process, acknowledging changes, reviewing our assets, opportunities, and experimentation with ideas. He would plan to use the process developed by Peggy Hahn at LEAD. It was suggested that possibly Peggy could lead the retreat. The purpose of the retreat would be to identify a new vision that will help us move forward, acknowledge loss of about 45 families and financial support of those families, look at our community and opportunities there, develop short term goals that encompass our 5 purpose areas.

Marc will contact Solomon Episcopal Conference Center about available dates.

#### **Purpose Area Updates:**

Evangelism: See Report. Worship: See Report.

Fellowship: See Report. Charles to get a quote for main line water to be placed for using sprinklers to water the garden. He reports Fruit Tree Orchard is not operating in this area.

Discipleship: None. Ministry: None.

Treasurer's Update:P&L and May Reconciliation available for review.

New Business: Scott Watson has requested \$1000.00 to finish out 6 additional garden boxes. Motion by Charles to provide money for this, seconded by Rachael. No discussion and motion carried.

Heidi Rhea has written a letter to request support from Hosanna for her cancer fundraising Oktoberfest. Motion by Marc to allow Heidi to use Hosanna resources to assist with advertisement. Seconded by Charles. Discussion regarding having a booth and assisting Heidi with fest as partner/sponsor. Nathan and Rachael volunteered to help. Motion carried.

Adjournment: Marc motioned meeting adjourn, Rachael seconded. Motion carried; meeting was adjourned at 8:37 PM. Pastor closed with a prayer.
