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The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, 12to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, 13until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. (Ephesians 4:11-13)

I am delighted to report the Church Council has elected a Call Committee to begin the work of calling a pastor for Hosanna Lutheran Church. The Constitution states the Church Council shall elect 6 persons to serve on the Call Committee. Those six are: Brian Nichols, Louann Stone, Dana Reed, Erica Hoffman, George Michell and Jillian Garretti. I know we have elected people who see the larger picture, have a spiritual maturity about them, embody the trust of the congregation, and have the time and ability to commit to the responsibility. While the Call Committee has a lot of work to do in the coming weeks and months, they need the ongoing support, encouragement and prayers of the congregation.

These six will meet with Rev. Tracey Breashears Schultz, Bishop's Associate for Leadership, in early October to learn how the process works in the Texas-Louisiana Gulf Coast Synod. Pastor Schultz will walk with the Call Committee throughout the process.

The first part of the Call Committee's work involves the preparing of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP), something all ELCA congregations must do. The MSP includes community data, congregational input, the congregation's vision statement and mission objectives from the August Leadership Retreat, as well membership and finance data. After the MSP is completed and approved by the Church Council, then names of potential pastors are received and the interviewing process begins.

There is no set time frame for how long the call process may take. A timetable is not easily determined. I will say to you what I said to congregational call committees when I served as bishop. A call process is a spiritual journey and those that are most successful see the process not as one of "hiring a pastor" but a process of "calling one to serve." Following an established process, working with the bishop's office, consulting with the congregation leadership, being open to surprises along the way, and enfolding the whole process in prayer is more likely to ensure a good and healthy outcome.

The Sunday reading from James 5 recently was all about prayer. Christians are called to pray for the sick, for those who are suffering, to pray for forgiveness that souls may be healed, for good weather as Elijah once prayed for rain.

Jesus invites us to pray. In Luke 11 he says, "So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you." So we are invited to pray for the Call Committee as they do their work, that they be guided by the Holy Spirit, granted wisdom and counsel in their discernment, and given strength for the tasks ahead.

And we are encouraged to pray for Hosanna's Church Council as they seek to sell property, address financial realities, steward our ministries to a new day, and help the congregation be faithful to the mission to which we have been called.

And we are encouraged to pray for one another, that we not lose heart. Let us pray for young and old, for the sick and healthy, for members of old as well as for recent visitors.

Let us pray that we all be open to God's work among us and attentive to what God's Spirit may be doing. Ask, and it will be given to you. As I said in my most recent sermon, stay calm and stay focused. Stay on God's holy path. God will provide.






Women's Book Club is making up their August book. If you haven't started reading, you have time! They will meet October 13 to discuss Ten Words to Live By.



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### HOSANNA LUTHERAN CHURCH SPECIAL COUNCIL MEEETING MINUTES Thursday, August 26, 2021

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:35 PM by Rob Rhea.

Members Present: Rob Rhea, George Michell, Amanda Watson, Charles Stone, Nathan Hoffman, Rachael Moore, Pastor Jerry Mansholt.

Members Absent: Steve Beene, Doug Burbank, Marc Reed

Special Meeting Agenda and Discussion:

10:30 Service: Charles moved that the 10:30 service be eliminated for now and the 9:00 service moved to 9:30. Amanda seconded. A discussion was held regarding the need for having some type of worship service in addition to the traditional worship service that we have been doing for both services. A caution was offered that we need to develop a more contemporary worship service that people would respond positively to. The loss of people the church has suffered is 90% of the people that worshiped at the 10:30 service and that's where we need to focus on bringing new worshipers into the church. Others agreed that a more non-traditional service is needed for 10:30 when it can be brought back. A vote was held, and the motion carried.

Pre-School Disposition/Church Sale: Nathan reported that he has been working on the pre-school and church P&L and they are not congruent. He continues to work toward resolution. He has discerned at this time that for the calendar year 2019 and for the current year, the preschool made and is on track to make \$20-25,000. This did not include any funds for operating costs for space (square footage used), utilities, or insurance which total approximately \$60,000 (provided by church). That leaves an approximate \$40,00 short fall in true operating costs for the school. Charles disagreed on this \$60K (cost per square foot) being relevant as it is a non-cost now and would continue to be a non-cost after a new building is bought/rented/built for HLC using NET proceeds from sale of property. Nathan noted that the church does not currently have an infrastructure to help fiscally manage the pre-school and recommends that we seek someone to absorb the pre-school.

#### The following points were discussed:

- •We might be able to find a building for the school separate from where the church is located. They would need at least 2-3,000 square feet to continue operations. Purchasing this space would cost more for the church.
- ·In the leadership retreat, everyone agreed that we have a lot of gratitude toward the school and want to continue to support it.
- ·We must ask ourselves, "Does the church have the capacity to have a pre-school, claim it and do what is needed for the school and itself survive?"
- •There has been a loss of 8-10 pre-school families because of the church going up for sale.
- ·How Hosanna handles the pre-school right now will have long term consequences. It needs to be a high priority for the church to resolve.
- •Faculty and parents have lots of questions and will be meeting soon. Parents are coming in for meet and greet on September 1st.
- ·Upcoming Stewardship program might help with money to keep the school open.
- ·We should be committed to assisting the pre-school finish out this school year. Current pre-school numbers at 72, not 100.
- •Since it takes longer to close a commercial sale, we have at least 90 to 120 days. A practical plan is needed to assist pre-school for the remainder of this school year if the building is sold and must be vacated before May. Conversations need to begin about how this can happen.
- It was noted that we need to decide to either keep or not keep the pre-school but find a location for the school until the end of the current year if we sell our building.
- •Question came up, "Does this have to go before the congregation", i.e., pre-school no longer being a part of the church ministry? It was noted that we do not need a congregational vote. It is important that we remain transparent (communicate rationale and expense questions and concerns which affect Hosanna's vision and growth strategies) with our decisions, and it is important to take care of the pre-school. Our concern now must be for the current year and to help them find a place for the future as needed. How we handle the pre-school now will affect our overall church ministry.
- It was mentioned that a new pastor may or may not be supportive of a pre-school. It was noted that we will need a full-time pastor to help the church grow. George made a motion to financially subsidize to get the pre-school through the year. Before the motion was seconded Nathan noted that this does not solve the problem of whether the church should continue its relationship with the preschool and a vote to subsidize the preschool couldn't happen until the preschool relationship was decided. Rob suggested voting on whether to continue supporting the preschool before voting on financially subsidizing the preschool through the year. George withdrew the motion.

Amanda made a motion not to continue to support the pre-school as a ministry and amended it to terminate the relationship by the end of this school year. Nathan seconded. Motion carried with 4 yes votes, 2 abstain, and 1 no vote.

George made a motion that we financially subsidize the pre-school through the end of the school year if necessary. Motion seconded and carried with 2 abstentions.

Future Church Property for Hosanna: A discussion was held about where to locate after building sold – Abita, Madisonville, Mandeville – with the following discussion points:

- ·Need facilities and location for a youth program and attract young families.
- ·Location may affect some of our older members who continue to support the church, i.e., 9:00 worshippers.
- Building will need church office, outreach area (kitchen), sanctuary (up to 150 people), classroom(s) for nursery, small groups, and youth group. Rob will talk with realtor about needs. George has volunteered to look at facilities.Rachael and Charles may need to assist.

#### Other Business:

- ·Oktoberfest has been cancelled due to Covid.
- ·Trunk or Treat is October 16th.
- ·Back to Church/School Bash with Potluck and small groups generating interest on 9/19 or 9/26.
- ·Blessing of the Backpacks uncertain.
- Rob asked that council members not leak any of tonight's discussion out until Pastor Jerry and Nathan have a discussion with Marilyn. The goal is to help Marilyn understand the conversation we have had and assist her to move forward with this school year and future plans. Nathan will find out her availability and set up a meeting.
- ·9:30 services will start Sept 5th, Labor Day weekend.

Adjournment: With no other business the meeting was adjourned at 8:10 PM. Pastor Jerry closed with prayer. Respectfully Submitted,
