Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again. Luke 24:5b-7

These are hard days. I write these words in early March just prior to our departure for a trip to the Holy Land. I do not know what the landscape will look like in Europe by the time you read these words. The military analyst on the radio said many will die this week in Ukraine as Russia increases its military onslaught.

Over 2 million people already have been displaced by the horrifying Russian invasion of Ukraine. Lutheran Disaster Response is accompanying our companions in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland and Slovakia, as well as such ecumenical partners as Lutheran World Federation and Church World Service, in their humanitarian responses to the crisis. These partners provide refugees with immediate support and supplies such as food, blankets, water and hygiene kits. We invite your offerings given here at Hosanna and earmarked for "LDR". Or you may give directly at elca.org.

In the midst of warfare and suffering we cling to the cross of Christ and the assurance of God's Easter victory. Luke tells us that Jesus was put to death by sinners. Rev. Tish Harrison Warren, an Episcopal priest has an opinion piece in the New York Times called, "We Are All Sinners, Accepting That Is A Good Thing (March 6, 2022)." She writes, "It can seem gentler and kinder to think of human beings as basically good, our intuitions basically correct and our motives basically pure. But then we run into the hard facts of greed, genocide, abuse, oppression, lies, tyranny, hatred, jealousy, violence, murder, enslavement and even mundane selfishness, impatience, arrogance or resentment in our own heart."

These days of warfare on European soil as well as political warfare in this country is evidence enough of the sinner-status of all humanity. We don't love God nor our neighbor as we ought. Rev. Warren quotes English author Francis Spufford who defines sin as "the human propensity to mess things up." Martin Luther used a Latin word to describe sin, incurvatus se, a life curved in upon itself.

Easter is about God's victory over all those forces that would defeat us--sin, death, and the power of the Devil. Easter says that Christ's death on the cross, his being handed over to the wiles of sinful humanity, was not in vain. God suffers with humanity on the cross, takes your sin and mine, your death and mine into his death on Good Friday. There on the cross he dies away all that would defeat us and rises on Easter morning in glorious resurrection victory.

As I marked the ashen cross on the foreheads of people coming for the Drive Through Ashes, I said, "Dust you are and to dust you shall return". Then I quickly added, "Christ the Life of all the Living, Christ the death of death our foe," this latter phrase from one of our cherished Lenten hymns.

In the midst of warfare and political upheaval, we sinners will gather in Holy Week and the Easter season to confess our sin and hear again the Easter Promise. Christ is risen from the dead. Baptized into his saving death and resurrection we too have arisen to a new life in Christ. We are children of God and by the power of God's very Spirit we will keep endeavoring to walk as children of God. We live strive to love God and our neighbor as we ought. We will show courage in the face of evil. We will advocate for the weak and vulnerable among us. We will confess our sin and strive to keep grace and mercy in our hearts. Or to say it another way, quoting a prophet of old, we shall strive to "...act justly, love mercy and walk humbly with our God (Micah 6:8)."

I look forward to seeing all of you upon our return from the Holy Land. Whatever the world might look like we shall rejoice in the salvation of our God. A blessed Holy Week and Easter to all of you.





Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:06 PM by Rob Rhea.

Members Present: Rob Rhea, George Michell, Rachael Moore, Charles Stone, Marc Reed, Doug Burbank, Pastor Jerry

Devotion: The meeting was opened with prayer by Pastor Jerry.

Approval of Minutes: Doug moved, and Marc seconded that minutes be approved as written. Motion carried.

Property Search Report: Rachael presented a spreadsheet with options for moving the church as of June 1st. See attached. A discussion was held. The council agrees that we should conserve funds as much as possible and continue to pursue a partnership with Covington Presbyterian Church. The Covington Presbyterian Session will meet Monday, 2/21/22 and will vote to move forward with relationship with Hosanna. After that vote, we will plan to meet with them to work out details of the relationship. Pastor will continue to explore additional options with other clergy in the area.

Nominating Team Report: Rachael reports that the slate for election of officers and Nominating Team is not yet complete. We are still looking for 1 nominee for council and 1 for Nominating Team.

Investment of Property Sale Funds: All council members were individually polled, and it was decided that Hosanna would work with Thrivent to invest funds from the sale of the church property.

Pastor's Update: Pastor will be leaving for his trip to the Holy Land on March 11th. He has arranged pastors to cover the service on both March 13th and 20th. He will be back for service on March 27th. Pastor reports that he is prepared to continue his interim work at Hosanna through April. He is expecting that Hosanna will have a pastor by that time. He will adjust his departure date as needed.

Pastor has ordered devotion books for congregants for Lent. There will not be midweek Lent services since he will be gone for 3 of the Wednesdays in Lent. He is making plans for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services.

Redevelopment: George has been in contact with Pastor Markert. He is interviewing potential candidates. None identified thus far.

Treasurer's Update: Doug is working on a budget to present to the congregation at the March 6th meeting. Charles has developed a spreadsheet to show 2021 P&L deficit that does not include PPP, preschool donation, and insurance payout post Ida. Doug will review.

Adjournment: With no other business, George moved, and Marc seconded that the meeting be adjourned at 7:25 PM.
